What Colour is this Sound?

LENGTH

3-5 mins

LOGLINE

Can you see the sound? Or Can you taste the word? Maybe it doesn't make sense to you, but nearly 10% people

in this world have synaesthesia and associate one sense with another one. Let's see what it is like to live with

synaesthesia.

SYNOPSIS

Synaesthesia is a condition where a sensation in one sense triggers a sensation in another. For example, an individual with sound-to-colour can see colours, images and shapes when he/she isexposed to a sound. Or an individual with grapheme-colour synaesthesia can see colours and images with words. In this documentary, I would like to introduce the concept of synaesthesia to the audience, answering to such questions as why it happens and how it is possible. Additionally, I will interview synaesthetes and visualise their multi-sensory experience. Ultimately, the documentary intends to provide the opportunity to share the experience to non-synaesthete audiences.

Platform and audience

Synaesthesia is a fascinating subject which could attract a wide range of the audience, regardless of their age, sex and class. But the documentary is particularly aimed at non-synaesthete audiences who could not imagine what it is like to feel music in colours, tastes words, and smell images.

MAIN CHARACTERS

For this project, we need synaesthetes who could depict their experience to non-synaesthete audiences and give answers to our curiosity. Also, a researcher who could explain the concept to the audiences is required.

STRUCTURE

The documentary begins with the interview with an expert. The expert will explain what synaesthesia is and answer some of the questions that we have as non-synaesthete such as 'Is someone born with the condition or does it get developed?', 'Does this run in the family?' After the interview, the audience will face some of the options which let them watch a story of each synaesthete. Each story will have a format of interactive documentary. Each synaesthete tells what synaesthesia he/she has, how she/he first found it out, what it is like to live with synaesthesia and other questions that we(non-synaesthete) have been curious about.

STYLE

This documentary is an interactive explainer video which illustrates the concept of synaesthesia and helps non-synaesthetes to feel the multisensory experience. In terms of presenting interactive videos, We have referred Bread and Seven Deadly Digital Sins which are interactive videos engage with the audience by leading audiences to select a story they would like to watch and read. Also, in terms of editing and structuring the video, we have referred to 'Colour and Vision' which is an expository documentary illustrates what influence colour has on us and how it affects us. I will provide a variety of vivid colours to the audience to visually stimulate them.

FORMAT AND OTHER PRODUCTION INFORMATION

Interviews with chromesthetes and researchers will be filmed by JVC camera. However, it is also necessary to shoot some footage for sequences, and sequence shooting will be carried out by a filmic pro, iPhone/iPod and gimbal. Because of its interactive characteristic, audiences are recommended to watch this video on an online or mobile platform.

FEASIBILITY

We have contacted UK Synaesthesia Association and Synaesthesia Research Group for the interview and have got positive responses from them. Also, we have contacted a synaesthesia researcher from Goldsmiths, and we are waiting for his responses to interview enquiry. In order to stimulate audiences' senses, props with vivid colours and various textures are required. We have come up with an idea of water marble painting. Also, we could use items such as colourful furry pompoms, velvet items, m&m chocolates, fruits and vegetables.


